1) Your infant may not need this dose depending on the type of vaccine that your health care provider uses. 2) This dose of DTaP may be given as early as age 12 months if it has been 6 months since the previous dose. 3) Children with certain medical condition will need a third dose. 4) This vaccine may be given to healthy teens. It is also recommended for adolescents with certain health conditions. 5) Your teen may need an additional dose depending on your healthcare providers recommendation.

**What is "Catch-up?":** If your child's vaccinations are overdue or missing, get your child caught up as soon as possible. If your child has not completed a series of vaccinations on time, he or she will need only the remainder of the vaccinations in the series. There is no need to start over.

**Please Remember:** Child's up-to-date shot record and insurance card is required at time of service.

- The Health Department participates in the federally-funded "Vaccines For Children" (VFC) program.
- Please contact the Public Health Clinic (419-774-4700) for pricing
- There is no charge if unable to pay.
- Medicaid and Medicaid Managed Care are accepted. Most private insurance companies billed.
- Children must be accompanied by a parent/legal guardian or another adult with written permission from the parent.
- CDC recommends everyone 12 years and older should get a COVID-19 vaccination. For COVID-19 vaccination for children ages 12 through 17 years of age please call: 1-833-4-ASK-ODH (1-833-427-5634).
- Adult immunizations available, please call to check vaccine availability.
