Attend one of our Community Health Screenings events to receive a range of free health checks, including blood pressure and blood sugar tests. Understanding your numbers is crucial in preventing health problems like high blood pressure or diabetes. High blood pressure and diabetes can increase your risk for heart disease. Public Health Nurses perform the screenings for free, and they'll assist you in determining whether you should schedule an appointment with your primary care physician to address any concerning results. KEEP ILLNESS OUT WHEN YOU STAY IN THIS WINTER

While the temperatures remain chilly, we are likely to spend more time together indoors. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reports higher rates of respiratory illness and hospitalizations during this time. Use precautions to prevent spreading germs and illness.

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV), Influenza and COVID-19 are respiratory illnesses that often produce symptoms that start off looking similar to those seen in the common cold. Although most individuals recover within a couple of weeks, they pose a significant risk of severe complications for infants, older adults and people who are already managing other illnesses.

Remember to stay home if you are not well. RPH strongly encourages everyone who is eligible to receive all the recommended annual vaccinations to protect themselves and others. Call to schedule an appointment at 419-774-4700.
